The focus of the National Education Association (NEA) is on four priority areas for 2022-2023:

- 1. Advancing Our Strategic Vision
- 2. Uniting Our Members
- 3. Creating, Safe, Just, and Equitable Schools
- 4. Securing the Environment

As elected members of the NEA Board of Directors, we have been focusing on representing the members of Nebraska at national meetings and conferences throughout the 2022-2023 year.
