\$1.8 MILLION AWARDED IN STUDENT SUPPORT AND ACADEMIC ENRICHMENT GRANTS

The State Board of Education awarded grants to 11 schools totaling \$1,843,000 through a competitive grant process. The U.S. Department of Education Title IV grants will help fund student support and academic enrichment projects.
